Camp Gastrointestinal (GI) Illness Policy:

- 1. When camper presents with vomiting, diarrhea and/or stomach pain, the camper and their belongings will be sequestered to infirmary or tent. If symptoms of illness continue past 24 hours, camper will be sent home (unless camper is not from USA).
- 2. Campers who display some but not all GI symptoms will be sequestered to infirmary or tent and monitored until camp nurse can establish decreased suspicion of Norovirus.
- 3. Parents of campers with active or suspected GI symptoms will be contacted immediately.

Camp Allergy Policy:

- 1. Mountain Camp is very committed to providing a safe environment for our campers. Our kitchen staff is made aware of any and all camper food allergies and sensitivities, and then food choices are provided accordingly.
- 2. Epi-Pens are kept in the centralized Infirmary and at the major activity sites. The EMS system will be activated if an allergic reaction occurs.
- 3. Campers with severe allergies are encouraged to wear a medical ID bracelet at all times. Mountain Camp recommends www.roadid.com for affordable purchase options.
